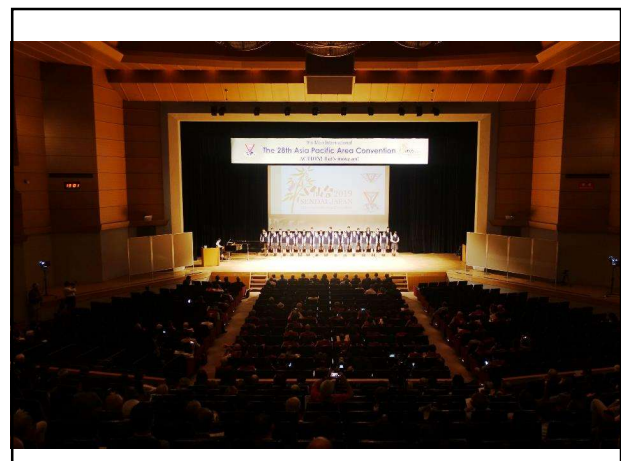
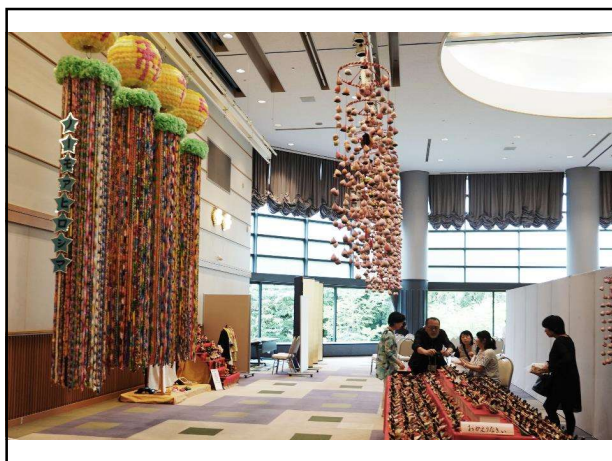

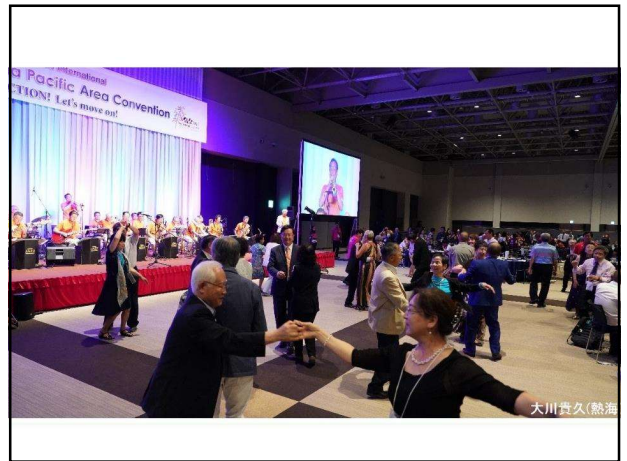

- Award for outstanding achievement in CS
 - One award in each Region
- Change in the percentage of ASF contribution to be sent to IHQ
 - 2019 - 2020: 20%
 - 2020 - 2021: 30%
- Remove 'Y Service Clubs International' from Guideline 101 of the International Constitution
- The request for the exemption from the minimum requirement of the membership (15) for the international voting shall be applicable only to the Clubs of 25 years or older, with 5-14 members

- The initial projects of the Paul William Alexander Legacy Initiative
 - Installation of a headstone for our founder and his immediate family at the Woodlawn Cemetery where his ashes are currently buried
 - Digitalization of our important documents stored in the Archives in Minnesota and creation of an online museum and promotion of the YMI story across the world
 - Establishment of a Y's Men's Legacy Wall at the YMCA of Greater Toledo
 - Purchase of IHQ office space, preferably in a building to be shared with the World Alliance of YMCAs in Geneva in a joint property venture
 - Naming of a Toledo public park after Paul William Alexander by the Toledo City Government
 - Establishment of a new international service project in the name of the founder

- **Spouse discount of International Dues**
 - For a period three years (2019-2022), spouses of existing club members who join clubs with at least 15 club members in the most recent semester be eligible for a 50% discount on International Dues
- **Removal of age restriction**
 - The requirement that any candidate for an IEO or ICM position be no older than 75 years of age was removed



- **New Guideline of ADF (Area Development Fund)**
 - Can be utilized in the following areas
 - To support Area Convention, Area Youth Convocation
 - Extension activities in the Area
 - Training of the Youth
 - Leadership Training

The typhoon No.15 (Faxai) that raged around Okinawa Prefecture on September 11 and the Typhoon No.19 (Hagibis) that raged the Kanto region and surrounding Prefecture on October 12 have caused tremendous damage over a wide area. People around 52 million in missing people, have been up to 52 more and 73 locations including the floor caused by the heavy rain later.

In addition to supporting volunteer work in the affected areas, we will continue to assist people to overcome difficulties. Meanwhile we will also work to change what has been damaged of their daily lives, then a medium to long-term perspective, aimed to support the reconstruction of the community, we will develop activities that are characteristic of the respective nations and characteristics.
