December is not only a very important time for the whole world but also in Y's men's Movement. We celebrate the birthday of our Lord Jesus Christ on 25 December and our founder, Paul William Alexander on 8 December, as well as celebrate the very first club chartered on 12 December 1922 by the name of Toledo Y's Men. Indeed, the Toledo YMCA opened their doors on 5 December 1905 (the building in which Y's Men started).

Our Guideline 201: "Based on the teachings of Jesus Christ" means that club members acknowledge what Jesus Christ has taught and that the acceptance of those teachings leads club members to be prepared to put His words into action.

DECEMBER --- A FOCUS ON HISTORY

As a matter of information for those who may not know; there are 3 books published for Y's Men International history. They are as follows:

1st - 1944First History book published covering the period 1920–1945, written by George W. Keitel2nd 1953Second History book published covering the period 1920–1953, written by George W. Keitel.3rd - 1972Third History book (Golden Anniversary edition) published, written by George W. Keitel.

For many, many years the position of Historian Service Director apparently just had to be filled. Historians especially on the levels below International (ISD), accepts the position; simply because he/she cannot decline the appointing leader. So, one has to make the most from the Service Director's Manual. While there is an archive, accessing it is a struggle.

Many will say we need to be looking to the future and not gazing at the past. As I have observed in my more than one year in this job, it is only the incumbent AP who shows concern over this task. Regions may not even have active Regional Service Directors, and if they ever have, communication, sharing and exchanges of information between ASD & RSD is nil.

Clearly, history's value is overlooked; whereas, past and present information gathered about the movement's life are important for future reference; it just can't be taken for granted; nor ignored. It may be a sad reality, but according to ISD Debbie Redmond "more than likely the position of a Historian Service Director will be eliminated as a Service Director".

I hope not! Otherwise, how will the future learn of the of the achievements and glories of the past; how will the future avoid failures and mistakes, if there are no pasts records to refer to?

There seems to be little, if at all, attention or importance been given by most regions to regularly and continuously contribute history updates to Historians. This scenario is quite alarming. With this observation, I offer these recommendations:

1) Club Presidents must appoint a Club Historian; Clubs are the real source of historical information; members do activities together.

2) The District Governor must appoint a District Historian, whose task is to collect all Club Historian's recorded activities;

3) District Historian will submit all the club history to the Regional Historian; and

4) Finally, the Regional Historian can submit this collection of records to the Area Historian through the Regional Director.

If this recommendation does not work, I don't know what else?
